Campbellford Memorial Hospital responding to Ontario Ramp Down of Elective Surgeries and Non-Urgent-Non-Emergent Activities

All Non-Urgent Scopes at CMH Cancelled

Campbellford – April 9, 2021 – Following provincial direction received last evening, Campbellford Memorial Hospital (CMH) will be cancelling all non-urgent scope procedures effective Monday, April 12 at 12:01AM. Ambulatory Clinics will continue to operate as usual.

This direction comes, as regions across the province see rising COVID-19 case counts and community transmission placing increased pressure on hospital critical care capacity.

The provincial government will be continuously monitoring this ramp down with a view to bringing on deferred services as soon as safely possible.

During these unprecedented times CMH is also asking that those visiting the hospital to support an in-patient, consider utilizing alternative options to connect with their loved ones. These include, virtual visiting and complimentary wi-fi and phone service.

While we recognize the important role family and support persons play for patients who are admitted to hospital, we also have a role to play in keeping are patients, staff and community safe. If an alternative to an in-hospital visit is not possible, please ensure you review our visitor policy before travelling to CMH.
